
A cute new pattern

The cutest little cardigan for the most beautiful baby in the world! So simple to make — so simple to keep soft and cuddly with frequent dips in Baby-mild Lux Flakes.

Baby's Cardigan

MATERIALS REQUIRED: 3 Balls F. W. Hughes, Twinprufe Baby Wool (White), 2 pairs needles Nos. 10 and 12, 5 small buttons.

MEASUREMENTS: Length from top of shoulder, $10\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Chest, 20"-22".

Length of sleeve seam, 7". **TENSION:** 7 sts. 1": 9 rows

ABBREVIATIONS: K. knit, P. purl, st. stitch, tog. together, sl. slip, wl. fwd., wool forward, wl.bk., wool back.

BACK: Using No. 10 needles cast on 79 sts. Work 8 rows moss st. Decrease 1 st. at end of last row. Work in following pattern:—Work 6 rows st.st.

7th ROW. P.2, *wl.bk., sl.2 purlwise, wl.fwd., P.6, repeat from * to last 4 sts., wl.bk., sl.2 purlwise, wl.fwd., P.2.

8th ROW. K.2, wl.fwd., sl.2 purlwise, wl.bk., * K.6, wl. fwd., sl.2 purlwise, wl.bk., repeat from * to last 2 sts., K.2. Work 6 rows, st.st.

15th ROW. * P.6., wl.bk., sl.2 purlwise, wl.fwd., repeat from * to last 6 sts., P.6.

16th ROW. K.6, * wl.fwd., sl.2 purlwise, wl.bk., K.6, repeat

from * to end of row.

Repeat the last 16 rows and when work measures 6½°, shape armholes by casting off 4 sts. at the beginning of the next 2 rows. Decrease 1 st. each end of the next 3 rows, then every 2nd row 3 times. When armholes measure 4°, shape shoulders by casting off 6 sts. at the beginning of the next 6 rows. Cast off remaining sts.

needles cast on 45 sts. Work 8 rows moss st.

1st PAT. ROW: K. to last 7 sts., moss st. 7.

2nd PAT. ROW: Moss st. 7, P. to end.

Repeat the last 2 rows twice. 7th ROW: Work in pattern to last 7 sts., moss st. 7.

Continue in pattern keeping the 7 border sts. in moss st. When work measures 6½" shape armhole by casting off 4 sts. at armhole edge, work to last 9 sts., K.2 tog. moss st. 7. K.2 tog. at armhole edge on the next 3 rows, then every 2nd row 3 times, and at the same time decrease 1 st. at the centre front inside border sts. every 4th row, until decreased to 25 sts. When armhole

measures 4", shape shoulder by casting off 6 sts. at armhole edge every 2nd row 3 times. Work remaining 7 sts. in moss st. for $1\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cast off. RIGHT FRONT: Work to correspond with left front, working border and shapings at opposite ends and making 5 small buttonholes, 1st one being $\frac{1}{2}$ " from lower edge and 4 more $1\frac{1}{2}$ " apart.

BUTTONHOLES: Moss st. 3, wl.fwd., K.2 tog., work to end. SLEEVES: Using No. 12 needles cast on 44 sts.

Work in rib of K.1. P.1. for 11.".

Change to No. 10 needles and work in pattern as for back, increasing 1 st. each end of every 6th row until increased to 62 sts. When sleeve seam measures 7", decrease 1 st. each end of every row until decreased to 18 sts. Cast off. TO MAKE UP: Using a warm iron and damp cloth, press lightly on wrong side of work. Sew up shoulder seams. Join borders together and stitch to back of neck. Sew in sleeves. Sew up side and sleeve seams. Sew on buttons to correspond with buttonholes.

To wash, dry and iron

Special tips

STOCKINGS

Wash after every wearing. Turn inside-out and wash in lukewarm Lux suds. Rinse thoroughly in lukewarm water. Roll in thick towel to remove excess moisture. Ease into shape very gently. Dry away from direct heat or sunlight. Do not iron. (These instructions apply to silk, rayon, nylon, and lisle stockings.)

Washing in pure, gentle Lux preserves elasticity, prevents many ladders, makes stockings last longer. That's why it's a good idea to wash them in Lux after every wearing. Nylon stockings dry quickly, rayon stockings dry slowly, and should not be worn until thoroughly dry. Be careful your fingernails do not snag stockings. Remove rings, except band-rings, before washing.

SILKS



Squeeze in lukewarm Lux suds. Rinse thoroughly in clear lukewarm water. Don't wring or twist. Roll in a dry, rough towel to remove excess water, unroll and hang up. Iron when slightly damp, with a moderately hot iron. Shantung and tussore should be ironed when quite dry — on the wrong side.

To test coloured or patterned silks for colour-fastness before washing, squeeze a small sample of the material in a glass of clear lukewarm water. If the water remains clear or shows only a slight discolouration, the colour is safe in Lux. If it's safe in water, it's safe in Lux.

CORSETS



Lux dissolves instantly and is ideal for articles containing rubberized fabrics. Squeeze through rich lukewarm Lux suds, washing both inside and out. Rinse very thoroughly in lukewarm water. To dry, roll in a thick towel, kneading to let it absorb the moisture. Do not twist or wring. Non-elastic parts can be ironed with a warm iron, while still slightly damp.

If foundations are washed frequently they last longer and fit better. Garments worn next to the skin should always be washed frequently, as perspiration weakens threads and elastic. Never hang your girdle by the suspenders but fold over an unheated rail to dry. Bras should be ironed over a round pad to preserve the shape.

Special tips

WOOLLENS



Lux is ideal for woollens — it dissolves instantly and rinses free from the fibres. Lux-washed woollens are as soft and fluffy as thistle-down. Squeeze gently in lukewarm suds; don't rub — this may cause "felting." Rinse thoroughly in lukewarm water. Put through a rubber wringer or roll in a rough towel to absorb excess moisture. Never twist or wring by hand.

Do the whole process as quickly as possible; woollens should never lie about damp. In the case of hand-knitted garments, support the weight in the hand when lifting out of the bowl, to prevent stretching. Dry flat, and ease into shape while drying.

RAYONS



Squeeze garment gently in lukewarm Lux suds. Treat carefully — don't rub, pull or twist. Most rayons are weak when wet. They regain their strength when dry. (See also instructions about testing for colour-fastness under Silks.) Iron on reverse side with a warm, not hot, iron, avoiding seams, fastenings and double thicknesses wherever possible.

Don't sprinkle with water to dampen rayons before ironing. If necessary, rinse the whole garment again. Dull-surface rayons should be ironed when almost dry, and free from visible damp patches. Fabrics such as marocain, moss crepe and georgette, which automatically contract in water, should be stretched gently in both directions under the iron when the material is almost dry.

BABY



Wash baby woollens as in Woollens above. Babies' napkins should be rinsed immediately in cold water and washed in hot Lux suds — then thoroughly rinsed. Boil in Lux suds once a week. Put napkins through a rubber wringer or wring by hand. Dry in open air and when possible in direct sunlight. Don't dry white woollens or silks near direct heat; they may turn yellow.

Baby garments should always be thoroughly aired. It is advisable, in damp or cold weather, to give a final airing before the fire. Lux — pure and soda-free — is ideal for baby things. It contains no harmful alkali to irritate a baby's tender skin.
